The Project Background

The Mutual Understanding and Collaboration of Mekong Sub-region Countries' Art Network is a creation of artists and art scholars from mainland Southeast Asia and China, sharing multifaceted socio-cultural relatedness. This alliance contributes to the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community-building process. Currently, the Art Network members include Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, Thailand, Vietnam, and China, abbreviated as CLMTV & CN. These equal participants underscore the collaboration to enhance mutual understanding and art-related exchange while respecting local differences.

As an active network member, the Faculty of Fine and Applied Arts and Cultural Science at Mahasarakham University, Thailand, has played a crucial role in the network by hosting the International Contemporary Art Meetings and Exhibitions in the Mekong Sub-region annually from 2012 to 2015. The faculty created the Network Development Project; the ASEAN Fine Arts Collaboration of Thailand and its neighboring countries—Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, and Vietnam—on August 12-14, 2015; and the 4th CLMTV Contemporary Art 2016. These activities apply the mutual understanding and collaboration principles of the ASEAN Socio-Cultural Community Policy. Such approaches have significantly enhanced the networking of fine art institutes and artists in the CLMTV region. However, the project encountered temporary postponement due to some difficulties and the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. Later, China enthusiastically joined the Network in 2022. This broader Network promotes a greater variety of artworks and art-driven partnerships. Since then, the project's title changed to the CLMTV & CN Contemporary Art Network in 2022.

This year, 2024, we have actively continued the network and the award-giving process despite some political difficulties in some of our countries. This demonstrates that art and education can function across boundaries. Nonetheless, it may also suggest the need for a further strategic plan and action to extend the network's function more concretely and productively for the communities in the near future.

The Objectives of the Project

To celebrate outstanding regional artists in the CLMTV & CN Contemporary Art Award 2024.
To distribute the International Academic Book of Contemporary Art, which contains the biographies and works of the awarded artists.

Cambodia

Royal University of Fine Arts





The Royal University of Fine Arts (RUFA) is under the supervision of the Ministry of Culture and Fine Arts. RUFA is a university in Chey Chumneas, Phnom Penh, specializing in architecture and fine arts. RUFA is the oldest university in Cambodia, having been in existence since 1917, or 105 years ago.

The establishment of the Royal University of Fine Arts dates back to 1917. At that time, the Khmer Arts School was established inside the Royal Palace. Later, because the courtyard inside the Royal Palace was too small, King Sisowath tasked the French artist George Grolier, along with seven other Cambodian artists, with establishing a new Fine Arts School situated at the present-day site of the Royal University of Fine Arts. In 1965, the Fine Arts School was transformed into the Royal University of Fine Arts, which had five faculties: Faculty of Choreographic Arts, which was expanded from the national dance group; Faculty of Music, expanded from the musical school; and the Faculty of Plastic Arts, expanded from the Khmer Arts School or Fine Arts School. At the same time, two new faculties were established: Faculty of Archaeology, and the Faculty of Architecture and Urbanization.

Lao PDR

National Institute of Fine Arts





The National Institute of Fine Arts of Lao PDR is located in the capital Vientiane. This institute was established in 1959. In the early stages, it taught Lao indigenous arts until 1972, when teaching in accordance with international guidelines began. The National Institute of Fine Arts of Lao PDR has developed its curriculum to suit social changes up to the present. It plays a role in producing arts and cultural personnel for the nation. The institute also continually builds artistic and cultural cooperation with other countries.

In addition, the institute has expanded to Luang Prabang, Savannakhet, and Champasak provinces respectively. Currently, these three institutes are producing artistic personnel for the northern, central, and southern regions of Lao PDR.

The National Institute of Fine Arts of Lao PDR currently manages art education up to the doctoral level. It also plays a role in the research, conservation, and dissemination of national arts and culture. The National Institute of Fine Arts of Lao PDR has an administrative structure consisting of 5 departments: Department of Painting, Sculpture, Printmaking, Folk Art and Restoration, and Visual Communication Design.

Myanmar

Association for Myanmar Contemporary Arts



The Association of Myanmar Contemporary Arts (AMCA) was founded in Yangon in January 2021 by Myanmar artists with the aims of promoting freedom in art, revitalizing the art scene, fostering art education, and creating international networks. The association is new, but its founders are well-experienced artists, both local and from abroad. Recently, the association successfully arranged the AMCA curator talk series (online programs) with participation from local and international artists. The association expects that the continuous cooperation will lead to friendship and progress among the CLMTV-CN countries.

The AMCA has been instrumental in promoting contemporary art in Myanmar, providing a platform for artists to express themselves freely and connect with the international art community. The association's efforts have been recognized, and it has become a key player in the regional art scene, fostering collaborations and exchanges that enrich the cultural landscape. As the association continues to grow and evolve, it remains committed to its core values of promoting artistic freedom, education, and international cooperation, ensuring that Myanmar's vibrant art scene continues to flourish and contribute to the broader cultural dialogue.

Thailand

Mahasarakham University







Mahasarakham University (MSU) is a public university with two campuses: one in Kham Riang Sub-district, Kantharawichai District, and another in Talat Sub-district, Mueang District, both in Maha Sarakham Province. MSU originated as the College of Education in 1968. It was later upgraded to Srinakharinwirot University, Maha Sarakham Campus in 1974, before becoming Mahasarakham University on December 9, 1994.

The Faculty of Fine-Applied Arts and Cultural Sciences (FACS) is one of MSU's faculties. FACS was established 44 years ago, beginning with the Arts Education Program in 1980, and has since evolved into its current form as the Faculty of Fine-Applied Arts and Cultural Sciences.

FACS's vision is to be a learning and research center for art and culture in the CLMTV&CN countries (Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Thailand, Vietnam, and China). The faculty's mission encompasses producing graduates, conducting research and fostering creativity, providing academic services, and preserving the arts and culture of the Mekong Sub-region

Vietnam

Danang Architecture University





Danang Architecture University (DAU), established on November 27, 2006, is a multidisciplinary university in the Vietnamese education system. Currently, the university has employed several hundred academic staff who are lecturers, researchers, and experts with postgraduate qualifications.

During the development process, DAU constantly innovates, promotes international cooperation in training and technology transfer, encourages community learning, and makes significant investments in facilities to fulfill learners' needs. With DAU's efforts and contributions in educational activities, on May 14, 2018, the university was recognized by the Ministry of Education and Training as having met "The Education Accreditation Standards."

Dr. Pham Anh Tuan, the President of Danang Architecture University, has expressed his desire to "establish an ideal learning environment for learners." Therefore, the aims of DAU are to expand knowledge, develop skills, train learners to become good citizens, and contribute to the development of the nation.

Guangxi Arts University





Guangxi Arts University, referred to as "Guangxi", is located in Nanning, the capital of Guangxi, a green city in China. It was jointly established by the Ministry of Culture and Tourism of the People's Republic of China and the People's Government of Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region. It is one of the 31 independent undergraduate art colleges and universities in China determined by the Ministry of Education, and one of the 6 provincial (regional) comprehensive art colleges in China.

The university is selected in the National Central and Western Universities Basic Capacity Building Project, the New Engineering Research and Practice Project, the Ministry of Education's undergraduate teaching evaluation excellent university, the national characteristic specialty construction university, is the Guangxi characteristic advantageous university, the Guangxi doctoral unit project construction university. Guangxi Arts University is approved by the Ministry of Education with the qualification to recommend outstanding fresh undergraduate graduates to study for a master's degree without examination.

Chinese National Academy of Arts





The China National Academy of Arts is China's only comprehensive national academic institution, integrating art research, art education, art creation, intangible cultural heritage protection, and a cultural and artistic think tank.

The China National Academy of Arts was developed based on the three academic institutions of the Chinese Academy of Traditional Chinese Opera, the Chinese Music Research Institute, and the Chinese Academy of Fine Arts, established in the early days of the People's Republic of China. Its establishment and development have received the care and support of the leaders of the Party and the country. In 1951, Comrade Mao Zedong personally wrote the name of the academy for the establishment of its predecessor, the Chinese Academy of Traditional Chinese Opera, and inscribed, "Let a hundred flowers bloom, bring forth the new through the old." In October 1980, the China National Academy of Arts was approved by the State Council to be named. In August 2006, with the approval of the Office of the Central Organization and Establishment Commission, the China National Academy of Arts added the sign "China Intangible Cultural Heritage Protection Center."

Over the past 70 years, the China Academy of Art has brought together a large number of experts and scholars who have made outstanding achievements in various disciplines, such as Zhang Geng, Wang Chaowen, Cai Ruhong, Yang Yinliu, Miao Tianrui, Ge Yihong, Guo Hancheng, Zhou Ruchang, Feng Qiyong, and Li Xifan.

Fujian Business University





Fujian Business University is located in Fuzhou, Fujian Province. The school is a provincial public full-time undergraduate university run by the Fujian Provincial People's Government. It has been selected as a project university of the Overseas Chinese Affairs Office of the State Council's Overseas Chinese Affairs Office's "Overseas Huiqiao Project - Chinese Food Prosperity Base," Fujian Province's Ecological Civilization Education Base, Fujian Province's College Graduate Entrepreneurship Training Base, Fujian Province's E-commerce Vocational Education Public Training Base, and Fujian Province's E-commerce's E-commerce Vocational Teacher Training Base.

As of May 2024, the university has three campuses: Gulou, Lianjiang, and Mawei. The university offers a wide range of academic programs, including business administration, economics, finance, marketing, logistics management, e-commerce, and tourism management, among others. Fujian Business University has established partnerships with numerous domestic and international institutions, facilitating student and faculty exchanges, joint research projects, and collaborative educational initiatives.

Hebei Academy of Fine Arts





Hebei Academy of Fine Arts, located in Shijiazhuang, Hebei Province, is a private full-time undergraduate art college approved by the Ministry of Education. It is under the jurisdiction of the Hebei Provincial Department of Education. Hebei Academy of Fine Arts has been selected as a "college of the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, the Ministry of Education, and the Ministry of Human Resources and Social Security for the Training Program for Inheritors of Chinese Intangible Cultural Heritage." It is also an "Excellent Private Higher Education Institution in China," "Hebei Cultural Industry Demonstration Base," and "National Advanced Unit for Research and Practice of Entrepreneurship Education in Higher Education Institutions."

As of March 2024, Hebei Academy of Fine Arts has two campuses, north and south. The school has six secondary colleges, including the School of Calligraphy, the School of Design, and the School of Sculpture and Public Art. The academy provides a comprehensive range of art education, with a focus on preserving and promoting Chinese intangible cultural heritage. It has established various research institutes, exhibition halls, and practice bases to support student learning and artistic creation.

Jinan University





Jinan University, referred to as "Jinan University," is headquartered in Guangzhou and is directly under the management of the Central United Front Work Department. The Ministry of Education, the United Front Work Department, and Guangdong Province jointly built it. It is listed as a national "Double First-Class," "211 Project", "985 Platform", and a key university in Guangdong Province. It is selected into the national "111 Project", "2011 Project", Excellent Doctor Education and Training Program, Excellent Legal Talent Education and Training Program, National College Student Innovative Experimental Program, National College Student Innovation and Entrepreneurship Training Program, Ministry of Education Humanities and Social Sciences Key Research Base, National College Student Cultural Quality Education Base, National Foreign Language Teaching Base, State Council Overseas Chinese Affairs Office Chinese Education Base, National Construction of High-level University Public Graduate Program, New Engineering Research and Practice Project, Chinese Government Scholarship International Students Reception University, the first batch of national demonstration universities for deepening innovation and entrepreneurship education reform; it is a member unit of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area Logistics and Supply Chain Innovation Alliance; it is one of the first batch of universities in the country to pilot the credit system.

Jinan University has a long and distinguished history, with famous scholars such as Ma Yinchu, Li Linsi, and Zheng Zhenduo having taught at the institution. The university's prestigious status and extensive accolades reflect its commitment to excellence in education, research, and innovation, making it a leading institution in China.

Lanzhou Jiaotong University





Lanzhou Jiaotong University, located in Lanzhou, Gansu Province, is a high-level university in Gansu Province jointly established by China National Railway Group Co., Ltd., the National Railway Administration, and the Gansu Provincial People's Government. Tianjin University, Beijing Jiaotong University, and Southwest Jiaotong University support it. It has been selected for the Central and Western Higher Education Revitalization Plan, the Excellent Engineer Education and Training Plan, the National Demonstration University for Deepening Innovation and Entrepreneurship Education Reform, and the National First-Class Discipline Breakthrough Project for Gansu Provincial Universities.

Lanzhou Jiaotong University is a member of the "Belt and Road" University Alliance and the China-Russia Transportation University Alliance, reflecting its commitment to international cooperation and its role in promoting transportation and infrastructure development. The university's strong ties to the railway industry and its selection for various national-level initiatives underscore its status as a leading institution in transportation-related education and research in China.

Mr. OUK Chim Vichet

Ouk Chim Vichet (born in 1981 in Phnom Penh) lives and works in Phnom Penh. He graduated from the Modern Sculpture Department at the Royal University of Fine Art in Phnom Penh. Since 2006, he has been a teacher of Architecture and Urbanism at the Royal University of Fine Art. When he was still a student, he helped work on the Peace Art Project of Cambodia, created in part by British artist Sasha Constable. They reused weapons, turning them into art as anexpression of peace. Later on, he started using a variety of materials, including metal, stone, and wood. Vichet is also a painterexploring the elements of Cambodian identity and culture. His artworks are all about trying to end the feeling of suffering, destruction, and loss of lives and to change people's perception of what they see as love, humanity, and peace. His exhibitions have been featured in art galleries, museums, institutions, schools, embassies, hotels, and restaurants across Cambodia with his most famous sculpture, Apsara Warrior, on display at the University of Michigan Museum of Art.


Mr. SOPHON Samkhan

Sophon Samkhan was orphaned at a young age in Battambang province, but was later adopted and raised in Phnom Penh. From a young age, he was fascinated by clay and used it to shape animals, developing his artistic skills. In primary school, Sophon showed proficiency in drawing and an interest in design and Khmer script carving. He decided to pursue a degree in Fine Arts at the Royal University of Fine Arts, where he supplemented his studies by working as a freelance artist, producing sculptures, statues, and cement animals.

During his university education, Sophon's skills expanded, particularly in construction and architecture. Upon graduating, he discovered a passion for teaching and began his career as a teacher in 2006. Over the years, he has ascended to become the dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts at the Royal University of Fine Arts in 2023. Concurrently, Sophon serves as an adviser at the Buddhist Cultural Center, overseeing student thesis projects and encouraging experimentation with diverse materials.

Sophon's endeavors aim to provide training and knowledge to university students and the broader public through the Sophon Samkhan construct team. This initiative empowers individuals in rural areas with valuable skills and employment opportunities to support their families, with the ultimate goal of promoting, conserving, and developing cherished artistic traditions. He remains committed to exploring new ideas to contribute to the continued growth and dissemination of Khmer traditional art.

Sophon's dedication and achievements have been recognized through numerous awards, including the Grand Order of National Merit, Royal Order of Cambodia, Royal Order of Moniseraphon, and various labor medals. His roles have included Vice Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts (2009), Acting Dean (2022), and Dean (2023-present), demonstrating his leadership and impact in the field of Khmer traditional arts.

Mr. SOU Kimsan

Kimsan was born in 1992 in Kandal province. Since very young age, he was inspired by pagoda arts nearby his primary school, which aspired him to be a painter in the future. In 2010, he moved to the city to pursue his academic dream. Kimsan graduated from Royal University of Fine Arts in bachelor of art in Oil Painting in 2014, where he found his real passion to be a painter. He received another bachelor degree in English from Norton University two years later in 2016.

Kimsan is now pursuing a master's degree in painting at Royal Academy of Cambodia. Starting in 2012, he studied in private art school (Yamada School of Art). In the following years, Kimsan became a teacher at this art school from 2018 to 2021. He is an art teacher who is teaching at Royal University of Fine Arts, a

freelance painter and a book illustrator.

Kimsan loves to explore new things, which explains his experience in not only the traditional paintings, but also in digital paintings. He further intends to explore his work to installation, printmaking, and sculpture. Starting from human figures, his arts style depicted more on people's lives. Later on, his arts gradually got inspired from traditional dance and shaped his passion in Cambodian culture and identity.

Since 2012, he has participated in various group painting projects both locally and internationally, holding exhibitions in Japan, South Korea, China, Thailand, and Indonesia. Being in a part of the art community, he loves contribute to change and glorify Cambodia's art; especially painting.

Mr. Bounkham Douangchanhom

Mr. Bounkham Duangchanhome, born on May 6, 1957, began his arts education at the Lao School of Fine Arts from 1972 to 1975. He furthered his studies at the National Institute of Fine Arts from 2007 to 2008. After completing his education, Mr. Duangchanhome embarked on a long career in the arts. From 1979 to 2019, he served as a professor at the Institute of Fine Arts, where he also held the position of Head of the Sculpture Department, sharing his expertise with students over several decades.

His notable domestic works include sculptures adorning prominent locations such as the National Assembly building and Pha That Luang in Vientiane, the Cultural Garden in Vientiane, city monuments in Sekong Province, and the Heroic Monument in Xiangkhouang Province. Internationally, his work includes a carved beehive sculpture in Ubonrachathani, Thailand (awarded a trophy) in 2002, carved stone sculptures in Vietnam in 2004 and again in South Korea, and carved wood sculptures at the World Garden in Kunming, China.

Currently retired from government service, Mr. Duangchanhome is now focusing on his artistic pursuits. He continues to work as an artist, drawing upon the skills and knowledge accumulated throughout his distinguished career in fine arts.

Mr. Ananh Chanthasone

Ananh CHANTHASONE, an accomplished artist from Savannakhet, Lao PDR, has dedicated his career to preserving and revitalizing the region's traditional arts and crafts. Born in 1990 in Savannakhet province, Ananh received his formal education at the Savannakhet Fine Arts School and the National Institute of Fine Arts in Vientiane.


Professor Emeritus Parinya Tantisuk





Zhen Zhongyi, also known by his pen name Tang Wa and courtesy name Wolong Jushi, is a 67-year-old artist from Xinle City, Hebei Province. He is a national first-class artist, doctoral supervisor, and the founder of the Chinese Misty Painting School.

Artist Biography

Zhen Zhongyi is a highly accomplished artist who has held numerous individual exhibitions in the United States, France, Japan, Southeast Asia, Hong Kong, and Taiwan. His works have won many awards, including three national gold awards, seven silver awards, and nine bronze awards. In addition to his artistic pursuits, Zhen Zhongyi has been actively involved in art education. In 2002, he established the Shijiazhuang Oriental Art Vocational College, which was later expanded into the Hebei Academy of Fine Arts (Undergraduate) in 2010, filling the gap of no fine arts colleges in Hebei Province.

Artistic Development and Creations

The themes of Zhen Zhongyi's "misty paintings" are primarily drawn from rural areas, folk customs, and history. His style is simple yet not heavy, inheriting the tradition of Chinese painting while integrating a diverse range of folk art styles from the Central Plains. Zhen Zhongyi has published several books showcasing his paintings, including "Selected Paintings of Taihang," "Selected Paintings of Zhen Zhongyi," and "Zhen Zhongyi Paintings."

Zhen Zhongyi's painting style can be divided into three stages: the sketching accumulation period in the mid-1970s to early 1980s, the formation period of the "misty painting style" in the early 1980s to late 1980s, and the mature period of the "misty painting style" in the late 1980s to early 1990s. During this journey, Zhen Zhongyi deeply studied Chinese and Western art, explored and reformed the creative concepts and methods of traditional Chinese painting, and sought to balance rigorous modeling and artistic conception. He drew inspiration from Western Impressionist and post-Impressionist techniques, as well as the "misty body" painting style of Japanese artists, while rooting his work in the national aesthetic tradition of Chinese painting.

Mr. Ye Linxin

Ye Linxin is a 57-year-old artist from Minhou County, Fujian Province, China. He currently serves as a professor at the Fujian College of Commerce, where he is the dean of the School of Art and Design.

Artist Biography


Professor Ye Linxin has been passionate about art since his childhood. He was inspired by renowned artists such as Xu Fei, Chen Xiuqing, and Lin Maoyi during his university years, and later studied under the guidance of Mr. Han Tianheng. Ye Linxin holds numerous prestigious positions, including being a member of the Xiling Seal Seal Society, the Chinese Calligraphers Association, and the deputy director of the China Shoushan Stone Cultural Development Research Center. He has also served as a judge for various art competitions and exhibitions in Fujian Province.

Artistic Development and Creations

Rooted in the Min culture and the art of Shoushan stone seal cutting, Ye Linxin's calligraphy and seal cutting works have been widely recognized and collected by prestigious institutions such as the National Art Museum of China, the National Academy of Art of China, and the Xiling Seal Seal Society. He has presided over research projects on the evolution and modern innovation of seal cutting art in Fujian Province, and his course on Chinese seal cutting has been recognized as a first-class undergraduate course in Fujian Province. Ye Linxin has also guided his students in creating the centennial seal of the founding of the Communist Party of China, which was selected for a special exhibition.

Honors and Awards

Ye Linxin's artistic achievements have been widely recognized, with numerous awards and honors bestowed upon him. These include gold and silver medals from national and provincial arts and crafts competitions, the honorary title of "Fujian Arts and Crafts Master" from the Fujian Provincial Government, and the recommendation and approval to become a member of the prestigious Xiling Seal Society. His works have also been collected by prestigious institutions, such as the National Art Museum of China and the Buddha Memorial Hall of Foguang Mountain in Taiwan.

Mr. Lan Chong

Lan Chong is a 45-year-old artist from Chongqing Changshou, China. He currently serves as the Dean of the School of Art and Design at Lanzhou Jiaotong University.

Artist Biography

Lan Chong graduated from Chongqing Normal University College of Fine Arts in 2001 and later studied at Tianjin Academy of Fine Arts in 2004. He obtained his degree from Northwest Normal University College of Fine Arts in 2010. Lan Chong is an associate professor and master's tutor at the School of Art, Lanzhou Jiaotong University. He is a member of various art organizations, including the China Contemporary Art Alliance, the Gansu Branch of the Chinese Oil Painting Society, the Gansu New Media Art Society, and the Gansu Artists Association.

Current Works and Artistic Concepts

After graduating from university, Lan Chong found himself in the hinterland of Northwest China, far from his hometown of Chongqing. The stark contrast between the two regions and the solitude he experienced in Lanzhou led him to a period of introspection and self-discovery. Initially, he created some works inspired by the native landscape, such as peach blossoms and peonies, but soon realized that these fleeting beauties were not enough to capture the essence of life.

Lan Chong then turned his attention to the humble yet overlooked chickens in his hometown, finding their underappreciated beauty and using them as the subject of his "Nirvana" series. This exploration of the micro-abstract led him to a deeper understanding of the relationship between the self and the world, the micro and the macro, and the void and the real. Gradually, Lan Chong abandoned realistic imagery and delved into the realm of abstract expressionism, creating a series of "colorful world" paintings that seem to connect with reality in a mysterious and profound way.

Through this artistic journey, Lan Chong has found solace in the solitude of the great Northwest, allowing him to experience life more deeply and express the essence of existence through his abstract works. He believes that the true eternal reality lies in the abstract, and his paintings aim to convey this profound understanding to the viewer.

Ms. Chen Chongwei

Chen Chongwei is a 34-year-old artist from Yulin City, Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, China. She currently works as a teacher at the School of Fine Arts Education, Guangxi University of the Arts.

Artist Biography

Chen Chongwei graduated from Guangxi University of the Arts with a bachelor's degree in Chinese painting in 2013 and a master's degree in 2017. She later received her PhD from Maha Sarakham University in Thailand in 2021. Chen is now the director of the Graduate Education Department at the School of Fine Arts Education, Guangxi University of the Arts. She is a member of several art organizations, including the Chinese Art Anthropology Society, the Guangxi Artists Association, the Guangxi Young Artists Association, and the Guangxi Gongbi Painting Society. In 2017, she held a landscape painting exhibition at the Art Museum of Lijiang School Art Center, Guangxi Art Institute.

Artistic Development and Creations

Chen's artistic practice is deeply rooted in the natural landscapes of Guangxi, a region known for its diverse ethnic groups and stunning karst formations. She aims to promote the cultural prosperity of Guangxi through her Chinese landscape paintings, which showcase the representative natural scenery of the region. Chen's works combine realism with a variety of expressive techniques, including freehand splash-ink, drying, spot-dyeing, and fine brushwork. She strives to enhance the expressive force and appeal of her paintings, creating a sense of depth and dynamism.

Artistic Ideas and Interpretations

Chen's landscape paintings convey the impression of interdependence, coexistence, and harmony between the ecological people and the natural environment of Guangxi. She uses her works as a medium to explore and inherit the ideas and humanistic spirit contained in traditional Chinese landscape paintings, integrating modern urban, rural, and agricultural development with the Guangxi landscape to present a new vision of China's natural wonders.













Ms. Zheng Xiaojun

Zheng Xiaojun is a 40-year-old artist from Quanzhou City, Fujian Province. She currently serves as an associate professor and graduate supervisor at Jinan University.

Artistic Experience

Zheng Xiaojun's works have been selected for nearly 30 important exhibition competitions, including the Beijing International Biennale, National Chinese Painting Exhibition, World Expo Art Exhibition, and Italian Art Design Exhibition. She has been sent by the state to the Rome Academy of Fine Arts in Italy for a special art talent training project and has participated in cultural exchanges in Taiwan, South Africa, Italy, and Japan. Her works are collected by prestigious institutions such as the National Art Museum of China, China Artists Association, Rhodes University, and Northwestern University in the United States. Zheng has published articles in many CSSCI, EI, and CPCI journals and is the author of "Twenty Mirrors to See the World: Interpretation of Contemporary Art Forms and Concepts."

Artistic Development and Creations

Zheng Xiaojun was systematically trained in Chinese painting and engaged in traditional easel art creation in the early days. In recent years, due to professional "hybridization" and the influence of different fields of work and study, she has become more open and diversified in her artistic expression. Based on her concern, reflection, and discussion of social issues, Zheng creates works in the form of comprehensive art such as new media and installation, paying more attention to the era and sociality of the works, allowing the audience to get involved or even become part of the works for a deeper experience and dialogue.

Artistic Ideas and Interpretations

Artistic creation is the artist's own care for life or the construction of an ideal life. Contemporary art pays more attention to the expression of ideas, and contemporary artists need to pay more attention to the current society and life. Through different art forms, Zheng Xiaojun aims to express herself more truly and understand the world more deeply. Her creative inspiration may come from the little details of life, social phenomena, and problems, which she uses as entry points for her creations. As an artist, in addition to reflecting life and thinking about problems through her works, Zheng also aims to build a relatively ideal and harmonious art world and transmit positive energy.

Mr. Cao Hengyuan

Cao Hengyuan, also known by his courtesy name Bieshushantang, is a 33-yearold calligrapher from Shangqiu City, Henan Province, China. He currently works as a teacher.

Artist Biography


Cao Hengyuan is considered a representative of young and middle-aged calligraphers in China. His artistic approach is rooted in a deep understanding of the traditional calligraphic art form, but he has also incorporated contemporary elements into his works. Cao's calligraphic style can be divided into two main categories: the traditional and the contemporary. The traditional style focuses on inheriting and developing the established techniques and aesthetics of Chinese calligraphy, while the contemporary style explores new directions and discoveries. His representative works include Du Fu's Poem and Jin Que Huang He Lian.

Current Works and Artistic Concepts

Cao believes that the content of calligraphy can be divided into two main aspects: the textual content and the formal content. The textual content refers to the meaning and message conveyed through the written words, such as poetry and aphorisms. The formal content encompasses the technical aspects of calligraphy, such as the thickness and length of strokes, the width and spacing of characters, and the overall composition and use of negative space. Cao's works demonstrate a deep understanding and mastery of both these aspects, resulting in a unique and compelling artistic expression.

Views on Chinese and Asian Art

Cao believes that Chinese calligraphy is the core of Chinese art, representing the simplest emotional form of traditional Chinese aesthetics. However, due to differences in history, culture, and regional customs, there may be misunderstandings. Therefore, he emphasizes the importance of communication, display, and discussion to promote the development and progress of world art and pursue the true meaning and laws of art.
